


Different Customer's Habitats


- There are three main economic engines in China mainland, they are:
- 1) Yangtze River Delta
- 2) Pearl River Delta
- 3) Bohai Sea Economic Rim
- Other hot areas in western and northeastern China



Chinese Culture Course-II

Yangtze River Delta — The largest metropolitan areas in China

- Yangtze River Delta generally comprises the triangular-shaped territory of <u>Wu</u>-speaking <u>Shanghai</u>, southern <u>Jiangsu</u> province and northern <u>Zhejiang</u> province of <u>China</u>.
- In modern times the area is home to an economy the size of a medium-sized <u>developed country</u>, encompassing a <u>GDP</u> (when measured to <u>purchasing power parity</u>) of some \$2 trillion US, which is 21% of the national economy (about the size of that of France, 2,046,899 MM\$ in 2007 according to the <u>International Monetary Fund</u>).
- The area is home to a very extensive transportation network that include railways and <u>expressways</u>.
- The region is served by some of the country's largest seaports.



Pearl River Delta — The Centre of Southern China

- Since economic liberalization was adopted by the Chinese government in the late 1970s, the delta has become one of the leading economic regions and a major manufacturing center of China.
- Although the Pearl River Delta Economic Zone encompasses only 0.4 percent of the land area and only 3.2 percent of the 2000 Census population of mainland China, it accounted for 8.7 percent of GDP, 35.8 percent of total trade, and 29.2 percent of utilized foreign capital in 2001.

Pearl River Delta — The Centre of Southern China






Pearl River Delta — The Centre of Southern China



Bohai Sea Economic Rim—Emerging Economic Centre in Northern China

- This emerging region is rising as one of Northern economic power house and would rival <u>Pearl River Delta</u> in south and <u>Yangtze River Delta</u> in east.
- In recent decades, <u>petroleum</u> and <u>natural gas</u> deposits have been discovered in Bo Hai.
- Beijing is in the Rim, and it is the economic centre in northern China.





China Western Development

- 1) The main components of the strategy include the development of <u>infrastructure</u> (transport, hydropower plants, energy, and telecommunications), enticement of foreign <u>investment</u>, increased efforts on ecological protection (such as <u>reforestation</u>), promotion of <u>education</u>, and retention of talent flowing to richer provinces.
- As of 2006, a total of 1 trillion <u>yuan</u> has been spent building infrastructure in western China.

Northeast China Revitalization

• The core of the program is to revitalize the regions's traditional industry, while speeding up development in aspects of structural regulation, regional cooperation, economic reform, the construction of an environment-friendly economy, and increased efforts in education, healthcare, and cultural projects.

Rise of Central China Plan

 It is a policy adopted by the <u>People's Republic of China</u> to accelerate the development of its central regions. It was announced by Premier <u>Wen Jiabao</u> on the <u>5 March 2004</u>. It covers six <u>provinces</u>: <u>Shanxi</u>, <u>Henan</u>, <u>Anhui</u>, <u>Hubei</u>, <u>Hunan</u>, and <u>Jiangxi</u>.
